

Homeland Security Director 2 169 Number of full-time equivalents (FTEs) in 22 states with stand-alone emergency management offices. 15 STATES -> Emergency Management Homeland Security Advisor Twenty-nine states combine their emergency management and homeland security FTEs.

The number of FTEs for both functions stand at Public Safety Secretary/Commissioner Adjutant General The national average of FTEs, but can range from 20 to 1,146, proving how state capacity vastly differs across the nation. 1 STATE → Governor's Office NATIONAL CRIMINAL JUSTICE ASSOCIATION

FEDERAL PROGRAMS



- Public Assistance:
 - o Debris removal, **life-saving emergency protective measures**, and restoring public infrastructure. Local governments, states, tribes, territories and certain private nonprofit organizations are eligible.
- Individual Assistance:
 - o Housing assistance, disaster case management, **crisis counseling**, disaster legal services, unemployment assistance, and voluntary organization coordination.
- Hazard Mitigation:
 - \circ For actions taken to prevent or reduce long term risk to life and property from natural hazards.

FEMA AND COVID-19



- First on the scene
- Initial Federal vs State Coordination Issues
- Transition to CARES Act
 - \$2T package -- largest relief package ever passed
 - Coronavirus Relief Fund (\$150B; direct to states and locals; population formula)
 - \$45 B Disaster Relief Fund
 - \$13.5B Education facilities, \$3.5B childcare, \$4.3B public health agencies, \$5B Community Development Block Grants
